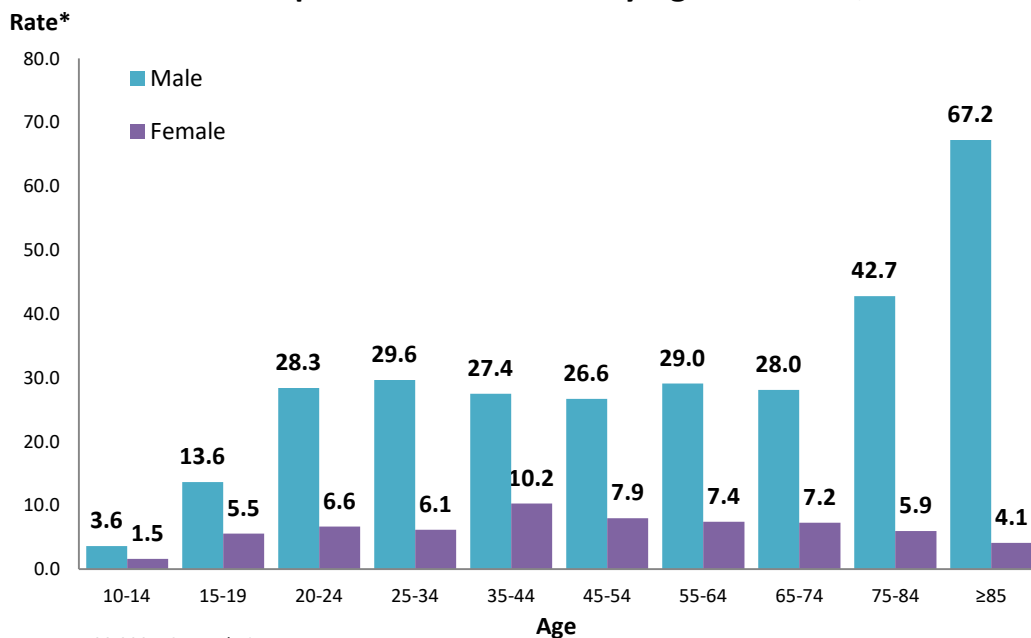


# NC Violent Death Reporting System

## SUICIDE IN NORTH CAROLINA, 2022

The North Carolina Violent Death Reporting System (NC-VDRS) is a CDC-funded statewide surveillance system that collects detailed information on violent deaths that occur in North Carolina including: homicide, suicide, unintentional firearm deaths, legal intervention, and deaths of undetermined intent. NC-VDRS triangulates information from death certificates, medical examiner reports, and law enforcement reports to understand and aid in the prevention of violent deaths. ### Sex-Specific Suicide Rates by Age: NC-VDRS, 2022

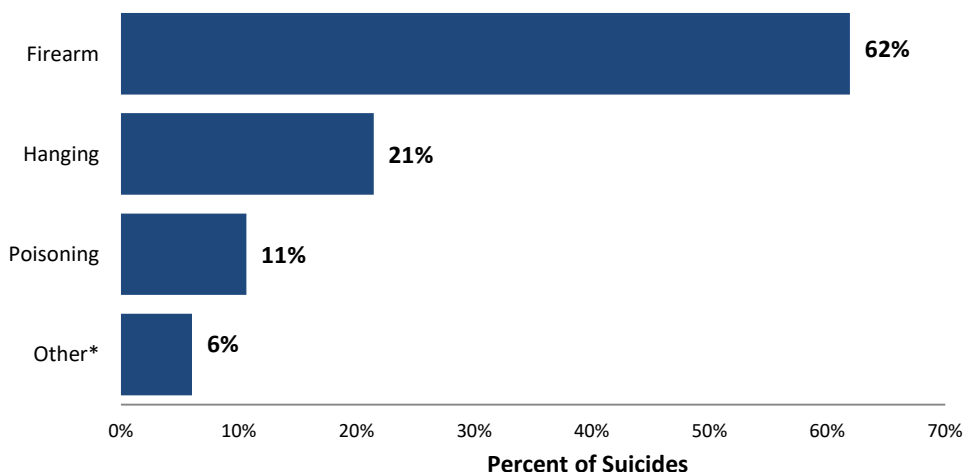


\* Rate per 100,000 NC population

- Of the 2,610 violent deaths in North Carolina in 2022, 1,562 were suicides (59.8%).
- Males consistently had a higher suicide rate than females, regardless of age. The suicide rate peaked for men ages 85 years and older at a rate of 67.2 per 100,000.
- Among females, the suicide rate peaked for ages 35-44 at 10.2 per 100,000 and steadily declined thereafter.

- Seventy-eight percent (78.4%) of all suicide victims were identified as non-Hispanic (NH) White residents.
- NH American Indian males had higher suicide rates than other racial/ethnic groups in North Carolina (36.0 per 100,000).

### Method of Death\*: NC-VDRS, 2022



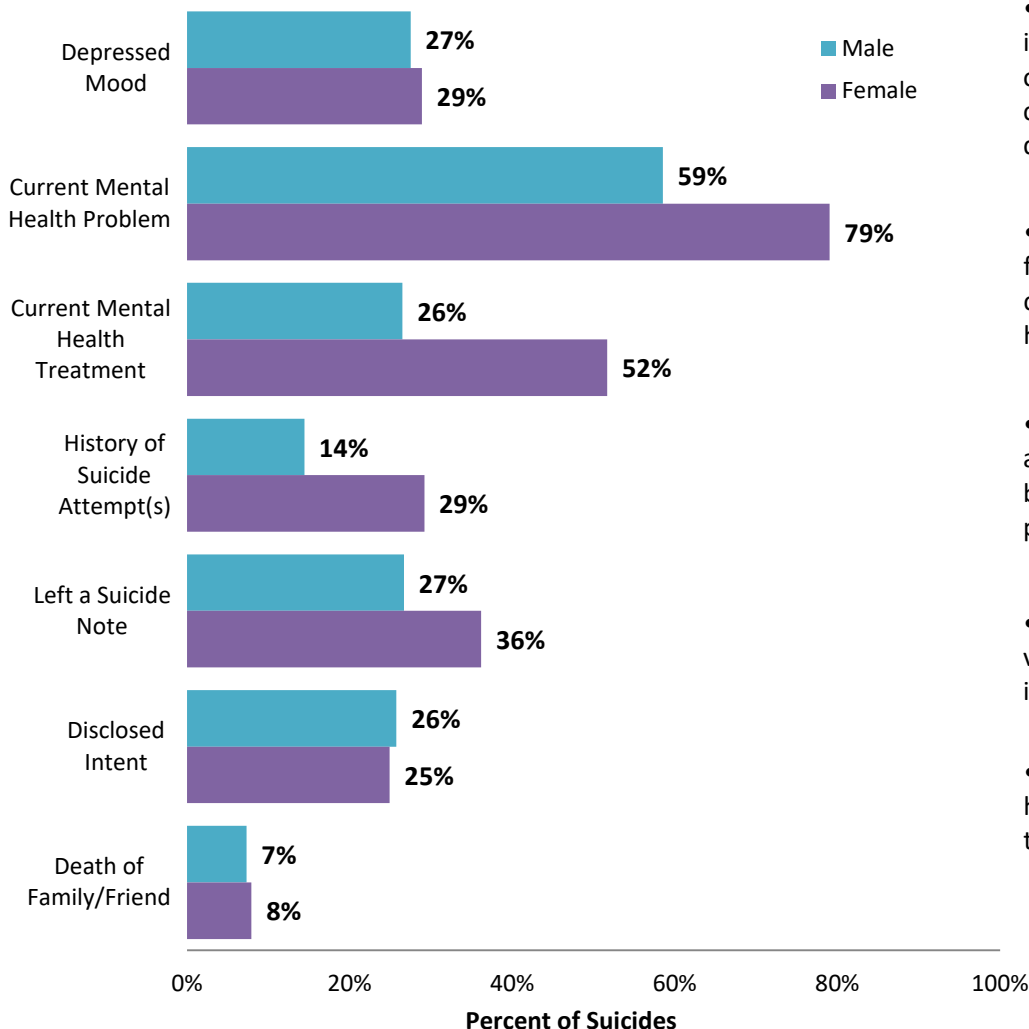
\*Other includes falls, motor vehicle, sharp instrument, drowning, fire/burns, unknown and other causes of suicide.

- After firearms (61.9%), hanging (21.4%) and poisoning (10.6%) were the second and third leading causes of suicide, respectively.
- Six percent (6.0%) of suicides were completed using a method other than firearms, hanging or poisoning.

## Suicide Circumstances\*: NC-VDRS, 2022



- Of suicide victims with circumstance information, 27.5% of males and 28.9% of females were characterized as being currently depressed at the time of death.

- Seventy-nine percent (79.0%) of females and 58.5% of males were characterized as having a current mental health problem.

- Fifty-two percent (51.7%) of females and 26.5% of males were currently being treated for a mental health problem at the time of suicide.

- Approximately 25.6% of all suicide victims had disclosed their suicidal intention to someone else.

- Females (29.2%) were more likely to have a history of prior suicide attempts than males (14.4%).

\*Among those with reported circumstance information. 97.4% of cases had circumstance information. Thirty-four males and six females were missing circumstance information.
